The words Integrity and Authenticity are often used inter-changeably. This is because they are very related concepts even though they infact have distinct meanings:

Authenticity is about being true to oneself.,

Integrity on the other hand refers to a person's steadfast adherence to moral and ethical principles.

The relationship between the two words is that Authenticity is the root out of which Integrity flows.
