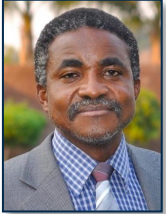


Bible College Consultation 2024

Speakers and Workshop Leaders



Rev. Jorum Mugari is an ordained teaching elder of the Presbytery of who serves both at the Theological College of Zimbabwe and the City Presbyterian Church. In 2007- 2010 Jorum was enrolled at Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary. He subsequently graduated with MANT, MAOT, MTH and proceeded to Northern Ireland where he studied under Queen's University and Belfast Bible College. In 2016 Jorum returned with his family to Zimbabwe upon graduating with an MPhil. in the Old Testament. Jorum is married to Evah and they are parents of two children. Jorum serves with John Stambolie as chairman of the Church Based Discipleship work.



Rev. 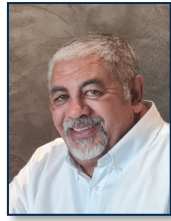

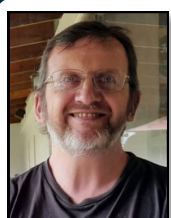
